Deb will contact Christie regarding previous back- ground checks made using Secure Search and the existence of passwords on office computer.

An application for a summer caretaker helper has been received. MSC by Tate and seconded by Arnie for Brenda to offer position to said applicant with a guarantee of an average of 20 hours per week during the months of June - August. If she accepts our offer, applicant will report directly to Brenda Knudsen, caretaker.

Tate continues to work on locks and codes.

A grant of up to \$10,000 has been received from MNHS for completing a structural assessment. We will be working with Joe at LS Engineers and Ryan at Prairie Fire Solutions. Meeting set for April 12,2022.

Christie Sutherland and Brenda Knudsen are currently utilizing the time clock and Heather will begin using it in April as well.

Brenda has requested the purchase of an additional vacuum cleaner. MSC by Tate, seconded by Jill for Brenda to purchase a vacuum not to exceed \$400 in cost.

April 12, 2022

NOT PRESENT:,

At 7:01 PM the meeting was called to order by Jim Johansen and a quorum was established. Additions were made to the agenda.

REPORTS:

- 1. Secretary's report for March was presented. MSC to approve March minutes made by Joan and seconded by Carol.
- 2. Treasurer's report for March was presented. MSC to approve March report made by Joan and seconded by Harlan.

OLD BUSINESS:

- 1. <u>Call Committee</u> the call committee was present to review the ministry site profile. They reviewed sections of the profile and will make some minor tweaks in the wording.
- 2. <u>First English Survey update</u> we reviewed the survey results, 60 surveys were completed, we will be meeting again with the First English church council on April 24th 6:30 PM.
- 3. <u>Piano Committee update</u> 2 brand new pianos have been delivered to the church. A grand piano for the main floor and a baby grand piano for the upstairs. The total cost was approximately \$60,000 and all of those funds were donated by the congregation.
- 4. Parsonage Projects update The plumbing, electrical, and construction work is all done on the two second floor bathrooms. They are waiting for vanities to arrive. The walk-in shower will be installed next week. The tub in the second bathroom is in. Waiting on a window to put in the second bath. Still need to pick out flooring and paint color.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. Pulpit Supply May & June Also May 30th Service For May Pastor Dan DeBlock is covering May 1st, Andrew will cover the rest of the May. We will be having church on May 30th over Memorial Day weekend. Joan is calling around to try and find someone to do communion Sundays and cover for funerals after May since Pastor Dan is moving on to a church in Pipestone.
- 2. <u>Graduation & Confirmation Cakes, etc</u> Confirmation is April 24, Senior Sunday is May 15th, the council is ordering cake to serve following the services.
- 3. Christie on vacation June 3rd 10th
- 4. <u>Blue Jean Wednesday date</u> primary date of April 27th, back-up date of May 4th. Start at 5:00 PM, come as you are able. Bring a rake!
- 5. <u>Aid for Ukraine</u> ELCA Europe crisis fund is providing refugees with immediate support and supplies such as food, blankets, water and hygiene kits. MSC to donate \$1,000 to ELCA Europe crisis fund from the Danebod Foundation funds was made by Harlan and seconded by Joan.
- 6. Bishop Dee visiting she is coming on May 15th and will lead the church service.
- 7. <u>3-Day Camp</u> Planning to have it June 7-9, but it could change if the RTR school board adds days to the school year. It will be open to kids finishing 4th, 5th and 6th grades.

8. <u>Prairie Conference Assembly update</u> – There are currently 54 pastoral vacancy. Some smaller congregations have been reaching out to larger congregations to share resources. Bill and Diane Clark are our synod assembly representatives.

<u>Property (Jarod Hansen)</u> – will be requesting a bid to replace the deck at the parsonage <u>Cemetery (Jim Johansen)</u> – Bid for mowing went to Cade Drake. Committee will trim some trees and spray for weeds. Plot prices will remain at \$400. Gravel will be ordered for the roads. <u>Parish Education & Youth Ministry (Lena Burckhardt)</u> – Jumping for Jesus has concluded for the spring. The kids led church on Sunday March 20th. They had an end of year game night on March 30th. An end of year survey was sent to the parents for feedback on the program. Outreach & Stewardship (Natalie Jerzak) – no report

Worship & Music (Carol Ekberg) - no report

<u>Folk School (Joy Schak)</u> – they are working on the pay schedules for the summer help. <u>Financial Advisory (Harlan Petersen)</u> – the committee reorganized at their last meeting. Investments are about 5-6% down. For the Ecklund fund moving forward they will split the funds 75% in Bremer 25% Jorgensen Financial for only the Ecklund Fund. Jorgensen Financial will handle all the other funds. April Thomas is the chair, Dennis Jensen is vice chair, and Jill Borresen is the secretary.

Celebrating the 75th anniversary of the Danebod Folk Meeting (one year late)

We are a year past our 75th anniversary of the founding of the Danebod Folk Meeting, but COVID had its way with us. This year we are going to celebrate together – in person, and the planning committee would like to extend a special invitation to all members of the Danebod community.

As a member of this congregation, you probably know that the folk school building itself, which opened December 1, 1888, was the first building constructed by the new Danebod colony, and church services were originally held in the lecture hall. As the congregation grew over the next 50 years, they built the stone hall, church, gym hall and parochial school. Danebod continued to operate as a folk school until 1931, when the depression and declining enrollment forced the Pastor Holger Strandskov to discontinue the folk school program.

During the 1930's, Danebod was only used occasionally for summer school and celebrations. From 1940 to 1945, it was completely closed and fell into considerable disrepair. When Pastor Enok Mortensen was called by the congregation in 1943, he brought a vision of renovating the building for the purpose of sponsoring camps and conferences. Under Pastor Mortensen's encouragement and leadership, the congregation decided to renovate the Folk School building, and on October 8, 1946, the Folk School opened its doors to the first "Danish Folk Meeting," a six-day course of singing, Bible study, lectures and fellowship. Things have changed over 75 years. The program has evolved into a four-day event, each day filled with singing, storytelling, lectures, and lots of time to celebrate being together at meals and coffee. This year's Folk Meeting will be a hybrid with in-person meeting on the Danebod campus and a virtual component so you can join us from home for as many sessions as you choose. We hope you'll mark your calendar for Aug 17-21 and plan to be with us!

Greetings to everyone.

The Call Committee wanted to thank everyone who took the time to complete the Congregational Questionnaire. Your input is valuable to our mission of finding the most suitable pastor to accept a call to Danebod. We are in the final steps of completing the Ministry Site Profile, which is the critical piece of information that we provide to the synod. This is what they use to sort through their pool of candidates to find the best match. We have brought our first draft to the Church Council and met with them to get their feedback. They had a couple of suggested changes that they would like to see. Once we finish those changes, we will present the profile to the council again. With their blessing, we will submit the profile to the synod, who will then review our submission and respond with any recommended changes. Once those recommendations have been addressed, they will post our profile on the ELCA Call Process website and begin searching for candidates.

We have had frequent conversations with the synod and have recently learned that they have had several recent seminary graduates and the pool of prospective candidates is getting bigger.

Bishop Pederson will be in Tyler for the May 15th service and we will be meeting with her at that time to discuss the Call Process and any additional options that may exist for Danebod and our search for our next pastor.

We thank you for your continued prayers as we work through this and will bring you more information as it becomes available.


