If you took part in any of the dances we did around the Christmas tree this year, then you should be more than familiar with the song *Nu Har Vi Jul Igen*. It starts out, "Nu har vi Jul igen og nu har vi Jul igen, og Julen varer ved til Påske!" In English, that's "Now it's Christmas again and now it's Christmas again, and Christmas lasts until Easter!" The next line (the one most of us mumble because we can't seem to remember the Danish as we're dancing) goes "Nej det ikke sandt, nej det ikke sandt, for ind imellem kommer fasten!"¹ or "No that's not true, no that's not true, because in the middle comes Lent!"²

Lent is the period of 40 days (Sundays not included) between Ash Wednesday and the Saturday before Easter. The quantity of 40 is symbolic of many 40-some periods in the Bible during which people took intentional time and steps to develop their relationships with God. The Israelites, for example, wandered in the desert for 40 years, maturing their faith under the leadership of Moses before they could enter the Promised Land. Jesus himself also spent 40 days in the wilderness in the time between his baptism and the beginning of his ministry, praying and preparing to follow God's divine plan for him.

Christians today observe Lent for similar reasons, using the weeks leading up to Easter to reassess and re-align our whole selves with God, especially through what's known as the three 'P's: *Penitence*- acknowledging our need of mercy; *Pilgrimage*- journeying with Christ; and *Preparation*- working together to live as a community in Christ.

Our Wednesday evening Lenten services at Danebod will incorporate these three motifs through our Holden Evening prayer liturgy and lessons. Every week, we will focus on a particular Lenten practice, from giving to charity to giving up temptations. We'll answer questions like "Where does this practice come from?," "Why should I try it?," and "How will this help my relationship with God?"

After the wonder and joy of Christmas, it's tempting to rush ahead to the hope and peace of Easter. But in the middle comes Lent. Together, let's explore what makes this sometimes mumbled-over season perhaps the most life-giving of all.

¹ There are several versions of *Nu Har Vi Jul Igen*, all with slightly different lyrics. Please don't take offense or spam the church office with angry letters if you grew up with a different version. I'm still within my first year at Danebod, so my "rookie card of grace and immunity" still applies ;)

² Technically, the order of the church seasons goes Christmas, *Epiphany*, and then Lent, but our nativity scenes and Christmas pageants featuring the wise men have conditioned us to lump Epiphany and Christmas together.

REPORTS:

- 1. Secretary's report for December was presented. MSC to approve December minutes made by Joy and seconded by Julie.
- 2. Treasurer's report for December was presented. MSC to approve December report made by Joan and seconded by Erik J.
- 3. Pastor's report She really enjoyed the Christmas Eve service. We got a wheelchair donated to the church from Avera Tyler. On Feb 5-6 Pastor will be attending a mandatory retreat for new Pastor's at Gustavus. Pastor would like to take vacation on the weekend of Feb 10-11. For coverage for Sunday Feb. 11 th Pastor will try and find pulpit supply, if not we will lead worship ourselves. She would also like to take vacation on April 4-7. She will see if we can worship at First English on April 7 th . The bible study group has started meeting on the 2 nd and 4 th Wednesday at 9 AM. The youth are having a video game night and will go bowling later this month. The confirmation students are going to be worship helpers during lent services: worship assistant, camera system, sound board, usher, etc. Lent services will be in the Holden service style. Pastor and Diane have been working on the membership list. The directories will be going to print by the end of the month.

The meeting was called to order by Jerry at 6:05 pm with reciting the Lord's Prayer.

KITCHEN & DINING ROOM FLOORING

Steve Sartell from CARPET DIRECT (flooring company from Brookings, SD) came to answer any questions that we had about the proposal. He also showed us samples and we picked out a color. This would include all flooring in the dining hall, kitchen, dishwashing room, hallway, and bathrooms. He said he would be able to give us a discount on this flooring since it is a larger amount of product. He also suggested to us a type of carpet that would be good for the ramp. He would get samples of the carpet that we could pick from. Jerry will follow up with Harlen on getting the water issue resolved. Mr. Sartell said he could get the product ordered and it would take 7-10 days (about 1 and a half weeks) to arrive. The installation would take 3-4 days and should be scheduled within a month after the product arrives.

BRENDA'S UPDATES

- 1. Henry replaced the faucet (not handle on toilet) that was leaking.
- 2. Henry moved the changing table to the other bathroom.

DEFIBRILLATOR UPDATE

Deb ordered the 2 AED units for Folk School. Adult pads and battery packs for the church have been ordered also and ALL will be installed when they arrive. Childrens pads have not expired yet are not needed until they expire.

2024 RENTAL RATES

Discussed that rates should be reviewed on an annual basis.

MSC by Tate and seconded by JoAnn to raise the Gym Hall rent to \$100.00/day and Wedding Reception-Danebod Church Member to \$125.00/day and all other rental rates should stay the same for 2024.



7th-12th graders, Sunday February 25th, 6:30-8PM, Tyler Ice Rink


