

One Last Easter Egg

A Message from Pastor Megan

Many movie-lovers know the immense joy and satisfaction of discovering "Easter eggs." Such eggs have nothing to do with the Easter bunny or even the Easter holiday. Easter eggs in the entertainment industry refer to hidden messages, images, or references from one story or world tucked into another. *Disney*, for example, is notorious for sneaking Mickey Mouse ears into the backgrounds of its animated features. George Lucas slipped the name of his first movie, *THX 1138*, into various moments throughout *Star Wars*. Easter eggs in movies are purposefully difficult to find and oftentimes require an insiders' hints to spot; but once discovered they give viewers a greater sense of connection to the filmmakers—a richer reward than any candy recovered in plastic eggs.

The Bible is filled with these sorts of "Easter eggs" too. An especially powerful one lies in the middle of Christ's passion. It's a curious little detail. It gets clouded over by the storm of chaos and emotion of the scene, rendering it easily overlooked. Fortunately, as readers, we have the power to rewind. We can scrub back before the famous epiphany of the centurion ("Truly, this man was God's Son!"), before the mysterious rising of the saints and the seismic earthquake that shakes the world. In doing so, we notice this snippet: "The curtain of the temple was torn in two" (Matt. 27:51).

Insiders "hip" to the Old Testament writings will recognize this curtain as the veil before the Holy of Holies room in the Temple, the supposed residing place of God. The heavy-duty curtain may have been 80 feet tall and four inches thick—a dramatic drape separating divinity from humanity, pure goodness from chronic sinfulness. But on that "Good" Friday, at the pivotal moment of Christ's surrender to death, the very first event to occur was the ripping of the curtain from top to bottom. The distinct symbol of God separated from humanity was torn asunder. It's as if God were shouting: "It is finished!" or "No more!" No more barriers between God and God's people; no more fear over God's reaction to sinners; no more threats to life when approaching the throne of grace. God's incredible journey from cradle to cross was complete. The true destination had been reached, and that destination turned out to be *us*.

So, with Lent credits now rolling on the season of Lent, if you find yourself still questioning "Am I good enough for God? Have I done enough to earn God's mercy? Am I worthy to be called a child of God?" then rewind back to Matt. 27:51. Recover the Easter egg of God's acceptance and grace. Like flinging open the shutters on a sunny day, we might feel the relentless love of God suddenly radiating in upon us.

A Well-Deserved Tusind Tak!

Humility is something that's deeply engrained in Danebod through both its Danish heritage and Lutheran faith. However, in order to stay grounded in humility, it's sometimes necessary to look up, noticing with joy and gratitude the blessings around us. In this case, we've recently been blessed to be a blessing to our greater community in some pretty extraordinary ways.

The Eklund Fund, established in 1987, holds the church's endowment for capital expenses. It also holds the key to Danebod's financial outreach. According to the by-laws of the Fund, 25% of the annual earnings from the Eklund Fund (adjusted for inflation) go towards local outreach and another 25% go towards greater mission support. The other 50% of earnings remain with the church and the fund. What all of that translates to is half of what we might earn in a year we use to help meet the growing needs of the church at large and of the Tyler area.

This year, Danebod was blessed to use over \$77,000 to serve our neighbors in need. The recipients (chosen by the Financial Advisory Committee based on both the values of and the recommendations from the congregation) included:

Most gifts were hand-delivered by Danebod members, and many gracious, personalized thank you notes have been pouring into the church office ever since.

While we are certainly not this fortunate every year, it's worth acknowledging that giving this large from a church in a town this small is not just extraordinary- it's *unheard of*. Humble as Danebod may be in size and location, this is an incredible feat to be proud of. Well done, good and faithful servants.

Absent: JoAnn Peterson, Cade Drake Jerry opened the meeting with the Lord's Prayer.

Pastor's report and other topics:

- Spring cleanup on April 24th (Wednesday) with a backup date on the following Wednesday, May 1st; Brenda will compile a list that we can work on. It will include the outdoor cleanup as well as tasks that need to be done indoors; Start of 5:00 pm.
- Jerry will contact Harlan about cleaning the pavilion with a couple of pressure washers.
- Most to take it to the burn site.
- Brenda, Heather, Diane and Bronwyn will meet before the camps start.
- While Brenda is on vacation from April 9 13, Laura Jensen will be on call

Flooring discussion:

- Start work on the 22nd, so work to get a group who can move the appliances and everything out of the kitchen; shut down the gas valves – when hooking them back up, should check them for leaks;
- The 21st is confirmation Sunday, so all of the activities will be in the gym hall.
- Deb will coordinate activities and Tate will bring equipment to use for the move. We are in need of appliance carts and a pallet jack.

Financial Reports:

- \$155 for Lodge will be changed to income and removed from expenditures.
- \$35,650 in donations are undesignated (\$20,000 from Marvalene Petersen trust and \$15,650 from the Ecklund fund)
- The elevator fund has been opened and Jerry and Heather looked through the historic donations and moved them into the new account.
- Deb motioned that we renew the \$10,000 (or whatever it is now and can be rolled over) CD for the Stone Hall; Olga seconded and the motion was carried.
- Tate motioned that we put the other \$50,000 (or whatever it is now and can be rolled over) into a CD after Heather checks on the best rate and terms; Jill Seconded and the motion was carried.
- Jerry will talk to April about moving the \$20,000 that was earmarked + whatever earnings were gained in the fund managed by the Financial Committee; Financial committee meets one week from today, will get this on the agenda;
- Tate motioned to approve the financial report with the correction of the \$155 from expense to income; Deb seconded and the motion was Carried

 - o How many bike spots? Do they want a lockable solution? Mark will research;
 - o Update to this discussion prior to these minutes being published via email: Janice sent Jerry the bike rack they recommend, a Vevor rack for 10 bikes / dual-sided for approximately \$160.
 - o Placement of the rack is still under discussion.


